ACALETICS® "A" Schools

- Twin Lakes Elementary attained an "A" for the 5th year in a row.
- Amelia Earhart Elementary attained an "A" for the 4th year in a row.
- William Lehman Elementary attained an "A" for the 3rd year in a row.
- South Hialeah Elementary and South Pointe Elementary attained an "A" for the 2nd year in a row.
- John G. Dupuis Elementary went from a "B" to an "A".
- Lorah Park Elementary, former "F" school, attained it's first "A".
- Benjamin Franklin Elementary, former "D" school, attained it's first "A".

Learning Gains

- William Lehman Elementary ranks #1 in all Dade County in % Making Learning Gains in Math (92%).
- South Pointe Elementary attained the 4th highest score in % Making Learning Gains in Math (84%) of all elementary schools in Dade County.
- Twin Lakes Elementary attained the 6th highest score in % Making Learning Gains in Math (82%) of all elementary schools in Dade County.
- John G. Dupuis Elementary attained the 9th highest score in % Making Learning Gains in Math (79%) of all elementary schools in Dade County.
- 92% of ACALETICS® schools in Dade County scored at or above the State average for % Making Learning Gains in Math (69%).

High Standards (Level 3 and Above)
